This list contains a variety of children's literature, covering a wide array of social issues. These books were selected because the characters in the stories reflect the diversity of cultures and languages of students in our classrooms. The list was created with upper elementary classrooms in mind. However, some of the books are appropriate for lower elementary and the higher reading level books are also appropriate for middle school. Some of the books are either entirely in English, or in English but with words in other languages. Many of the books are available in English and Spanish

The list is organized by reading levels and then by author for ease of navigation. The list also includes a short description and the language(s) of the books.
